Speaker's profiles

Dr Michal Boyd - RN, NP, ND, FCNA (NZ)

Dr Michal Boyd is a Gerontology Nurse Practitioner and a Senior Lecturer with the Department of Geriatric Medicine at the University of Auckland. She has been a provider, leader and researcher of care management for older people since the early 1990's. In 2011, she led the development of the Ministry of Health's Medicines Care Guides for Residential Aged Care. She is currently co-investigator of the ARCHUS study, an intervention study aimed at integration and support for aged residential care.
