





Access to treatment



- Treatment must be of a standard generally accepted in New Zealand, and must be provided by a qualified practitioner
- We must use public services or standard provision (e.g. ACC) 1st
- GP's are a veterans' first point of contact for any condition this approach ensures all health-related issues are being assessed and treated appropriately
- Private specialist care is funded where treatment is not available through the public health system, or where waiting would affect the veterans' health or independence.
- Veterans' Affairs fully funds treatment and prescriptions for servicerelated conditions

- Start by asking 'Have you served'
- Direct them to the Eligibility Checker: website
- They can ask for their service record from: nzdf.mil.nz – Personnel Records & Medals and Archives
- They can phone the enquiry line
- They can fill out an application for a condition
- You can fill in and sign the medical section
