Yes, we agree that non-prescribing NPs should be required to gain prescribing within two years, however it is important that a process be put in place so that they are not disadvantaged and will be able to practically fulfill the needed requirements to become authorized prescribers. This is also important so that the New Zealand Nursing Council is not overwhelmed with requests for portfolio assessments and panel interviews in a condensed period of time. A reasonable approach would be for non-prescribing NPs to complete 100 hours of clinically supervised prescribing practicum by an authorized prescriber. At the end of this supervision period the supervising authorized prescriber would perform a systematic competency assessment set forth by the NZNC of the NP to certify prescribing competence.
